How it will work?

Students will turn phones off at 8:25am and put them in their bags.

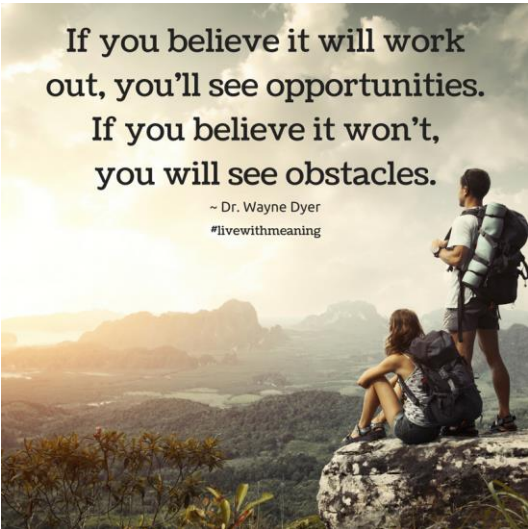
Tutor will remind them.

If you believe it won't, you will see obstacles.

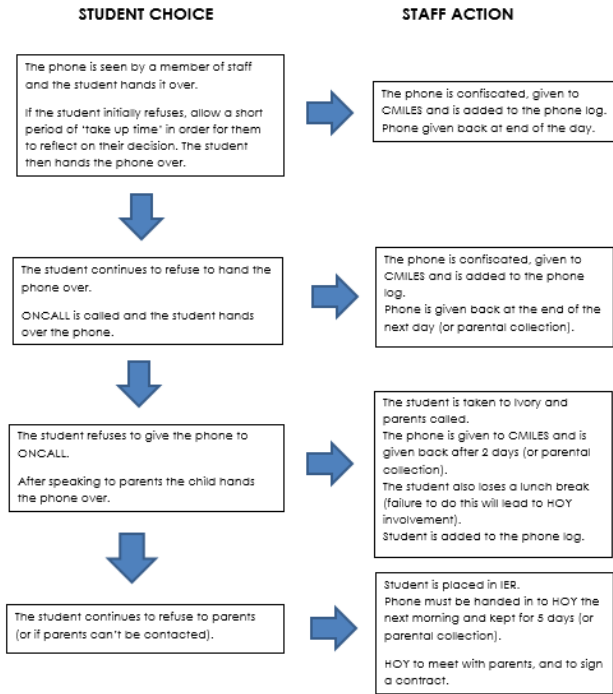

Classroom phone confiscating flow chart - DRAFT

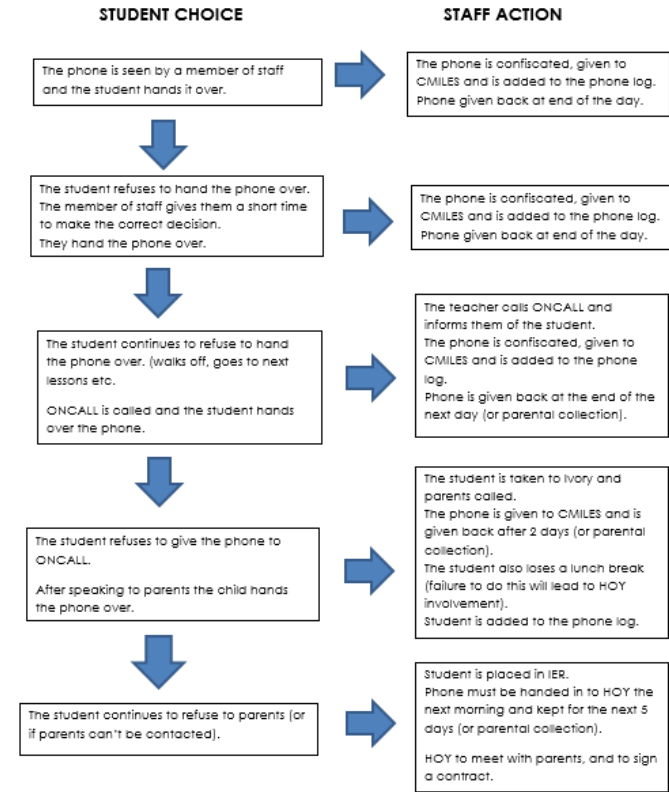


*If student is caught with phone twice in one week – their phone is confiscated for the rest of the week and parents need to collect.

**If student is caught with phone four times in a half term – parents invited for meeting to sign a phone contract – handing it in at the beginning of everyday, or leaving it at home.

***Persistent disregard of the rules may result in an exclusion from school and will result in students being put onto a PSP to their HOY to support them in following the school rules.
