Dear Parents/ Carers,

As we approach the end of this academic year, you may wish to plan ahead and purchase new uniform for your child for September. Our uniform is very important to us and is an integral part of the schools' ethos, one that promotes positive attitudes, high standards and gives students a sense of personal pride. We want our students to be proud of their school and our uniform allows them to demonstrate this.

To ensure that you have purchased the correct uniform, we have listed several reminders below of the uniform requirements for years 7 to 11:

- Traditional plain black trousers, must be loose fitting, trouser material and of a length in which the ankles are not showing. No trousers are to be rolled up and no jeans or skin tight trousers or leggings must be worn.
- Plain black traditional school skirt (of a decent length and not skin tight).
- A white school shirt (top button fastened, shirt tucked in)
- School blazer with logo
- School tie, worn correctly
- (Optional) plain, black red trim v-neck jumper
- Socks – for boys, black socks, for girls white or black socks or plain black tights with no patterns
- Plain black sensible footwear, with no logos with maximum heel height of 3 cm (no pumps or open toed shoes / strappy sandals or boots)
- (Optional) a plain dark top coat (not with big sports logos or denim and not a hoody).
